363 GEORGE STREET



A new office tower by Denton Corker Marshall in a style similar to their Governor Phillip and Governor Macquarie towers. Surrounded by heritage buildings, and designed to conform to the city's requirements for a podium base to George Street, the building is raised 10 storeys, hovering over the heritage bank building on the corner of King and George streets and over warehouses to the west. This has created a lofty foyer, filled with sunlight from the north. 363 George Street projects a ladder top into the sky, adding a new interpretation to the

array of city building tops. The infill along George Street maintains the rigour of the street and the human scale, acting as a transition
